School Improvement Plan Update

Mathematics - Our teachers have had lots of training around mathematical reasoning and problem solving and this has been immediately implemented into lessons. The children in turn are working hard to explain their mathematical thinking to show their developing reasoning skills. We would appreciate it if you could encourage your child to explain their mathematical strategies and thinking to you too when they are working at home.

Good questions to ask are:

- How do you know that...?
- So if you know (e.g. 10 x 6 is 60) what else do you know?
- Tell me about your thinking when you came to this answer.

Handwriting - As part of the new Age Related Expectation for pupils it is expected that they use a joined script and that all letters are proportionally correct so that it shows a child's understanding of capital letters. Last year, and again this year, pupils cannot achieve the standard of Greater Depth in writing if their handwriting doesn't join. We anticipate that this will become an expectation in order to simply meet the Age Related Expectation required in future years. We are, therefore, preparing our children as best we can so that their handwriting doesn't limit their attainment. Our new handwriting scheme is already having a positive impact on pupils' presentation of their work and they tell us they are proud of their handwriting skills.

Today, our Year 3 parents, family and friends were invited to come and celebrate the children's Ancient Egypt topic work. Thank you to everyone who came along to join them.


Festive Thanks
